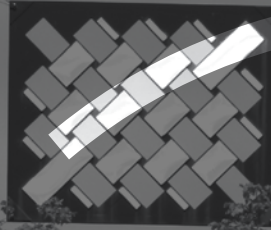

Education at Otago Polytechnic

The Academic Year: Otago Polytechnic has two academic semesters. The first semester starts in February and second semester begins in July. Most programmes start in the February semester; however, some programmes have a limited intake in July.

Qualifications and Paths of Study: Otago Polytechnic is a public institution, registered with the New Zealand Government Ministry of Education.

All of our programmes are approved and accredited by the New Zealand Qualification Authority (NZQA) (a government agency) or its delegate. Otago Polytechnic is a great choice for international applicants, because students can commence their studies at foundation and certificate levels and progress onto higher levels, all within one institution.

The programmes at Otago Polytechnic are designed to either be individual programmes, or, more commonly used as bridging programmes to enter the next level of study. For example, it is possible to enrol in a certificate or diploma programme and upon completion, enrol into a degree programme. Some students, with the appropriate entry criteria, will be able to enter a Bachelor or Masters degree directly. All programmes and qualifications at Otago Polytechnic include both academic study and applied learning, so that work experience and practical knowledge are obtained alongside theoretical understanding.

The Bachelor and Masters degrees taught at Otago Polytechnic are considered to have the same merit as degrees offered through the university system.

We are proud of our academic excellence and reputation in New Zealand and internationally, and look forward to welcoming students from around the world.

Study Areas and Description of Qualifications

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL): For students who require a higher level of English language proficiency, before they enter academic or mainstream programme of study.

Foundation Studies: Can be used as a direct pathway into a higher level qualification following the same subject area, and is a good starting point for students who lack the required academic entry criteria and English language ability for our academic programmes.

Certificates: Are often used as entry programmes and generally run for one year in duration, however, some certificates programmes are one semester only.

Diploma: A diploma is the next level of study after a certificate and is usually a two-year programme.

Bachelor's Degree: These are three-year qualifications, and there is usually a major subject (specialisation) that can be selected.

Postgraduate Diploma/Certificate: These can sometimes be used as the first year of a Masters degree and can be used for direct entry into the second year of a Masters programme. A postgraduate diploma or certificate, are also qualifications in their own right.

Master's Degree: This is normally a two-year degree which encompasses a postgraduate diploma in the first year. A Master's degree has both research and course work components, with a level of self-directed study supported by a supervisor. Self-directed study is generally part of the second year of a Masters degree.

Equivalent Academic Entrance Requirements

To study at Otago Polytechnic as an international student, (dependant on specific programme entry criteria, see pages 9-18) you will need a secondary school level of academic achievement as well as a good command of the English language. All applications are individually assessed.

To be eligible for entry to undergraduate programmes all students must hold qualifications that are acceptable to Otago Polytechnic. In New Zealand, entrance to Polytechnic is normally achieved through the New Zealand National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA.) Visit www.nzqa.govt.nz. The Polytechnic recognises many other international qualifications as equivalent to the New Zealand qualification for entrance and some of these are listed below:

English Language Admission Requirements

All courses and programmes at Otago Polytechnic are taught and examined, in English. If English is not your first language, you must provide evidence of a satisfactory level of English language proficiency. If applicable, you must include with your application, a certified statement of results from an acceptable English language test.

For entry, all academic programmes require an IELTS or TOEFL score, or an equivalent. All English language results must be supplied in original format, as a certified copy, or, if applicable, as a test result form number.

Please note that programmes in our Health and Wellbeing Careers area require specific English language entry requirements. These are noted in the table below.

If your English proficiency does not yet meet the required standard, you may take Otago Polytechnic's English as a Second Language / Certificate in Foundation Studies Programmes.

Foundation Learning - Bridging Programmes

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) and the Certificate in Foundation Studies (ESOL): provides English at levels 1 (beginner) to 4 (advanced), and prepares you for further academic study. The Certificate is made up of courses in English as a Second Language covering the four basic skills of reading, writing, listening and speaking. There is a level of study appropriate for students with any level of English language ability who are looking to improve their skills to enter higher-level study or employment. Our placement test or the student's recent IELTS (or equivalent) result will help us to place students at the appropriate level for the Certificate in Foundation Studies (ESOL).

Foundation Studies: is an entry point that leads to a bridging programme in business, computing, health or sport and adventure, and finishes with a Bachelor's degree or higher. The Foundation Studies (ESOL) programme helps you to develop speaking, listening, reading and writing so that you can study in other programmes or enter the workforce. It helps you to communicate more easily in English-speaking communities. The small classes, supportive teachers and conversation with volunteers from the community will help students to gain social skills, confidence and academic ability.

Certificate in Foundation Studies (Level 1 to 4) ESOL English for Speakers of Other Languages

Level 1: Beginner - At the end of this programme, students are able to understand short, simple reading texts and conversations. Students are able to write short sentences and speak in simple conversations.

Level 2: Pre-Intermediate - At the end of this programme, students will be able to understand some common short, simple reading texts and conversations. Students will also be able to take part in a simple conversation and write some common types of texts.

Level 3: Intermediate - At the end of this programme, students will be able to understand reading texts and conversations on some less familiar topics. They will be able to write a viewpoint and speak about some less familiar topics.

Level 4: Advanced - At the end of this programme, students are able to understand a range of different topics beyond everyday immediate experiences in reading texts and conversations. They will be able to write extended texts of various types and speak on a range of unfamiliar topics in a variety of contexts. As well as English language classes, students will also take elective academic courses.

Application Procedure

A. Application Procedures for International Students Completing NCEA in New Zealand Secondary Schools

Please complete and return the application form for international students, and include all required documentation to International Admissions at Otago Polytechnic.

Academic Results: Final NCEA results will be automatically supplied to Otago Polytechnic. You may be asked to provide a certified copy of your results to Otago Polytechnic.

English Language Proficiency: All NCEA Students must complete the required literacy standards. See English Language Admission Requirements on pages 6 and 7.

B. Application Procedures for All Other International Students

Please complete and return the application form for international students, and include all required documentation to International Admissions at Otago Polytechnic.

Qualification Evaluation: For tertiary qualifications other than those listed on pages 4 and 5, you may need to (at the Polytechnic's request) provide an Educational Credentials Evaluation (ECE).

The Polytechnic reserves the right to request an ECE even if the student's qualification is listed previously.

You will have to request and pay for the course by course evaluation, with you and the Polytechnic each receiving a copy of the resulting evaluation report. The evaluation report is an important part of our admissions process and helps to ensure that the Polytechnic is admitting qualified candidates. The application form can be downloaded from the ECE website. Visit: **www.ece.org**. Your application will be processed when the evaluation report is received by Otago Polytechnic.

Application Closing Dates:

First Semester Start (February)

Applications close 31 October, but late applications not requiring external evaluation for entry criteria or further documentation, may be considered until November 30.

Second Semester Start (July)

Applications close April 30, but late applications not requiring evaluation for entry criteria or further documentation, may be considered until May 31.

All applications will be acknowledged when received by International Admissions. The applications are then sent to the appropriate school or department for final acceptance. International Admissions will aim to respond quickly and efficiently to you or your agent. If you do not meet our entry criteria, but we can accept you provisionally into your selected programme of study, we will send you a "Conditional Acceptance Letter". This letter will include the conditions you have to meet in order to get a confirmed Offer of Place. Once you have met these conditions, a second letter will be sent you to confirm your place.

Programme and Qualification Details, with Tuition Fees

Enrolment in a programme or course is conditional upon and subject to sufficient numbers of students enrolling in the programme/course. Tuition fees are assessed each year, and are subject to change. All fees are inclusive of GST (New Zealand Goods and Services Tax.)

Tuition fees include Otago Polytechnic's compulsory additional costs, for Student Services, including Otago Polytechnic Students' Association (OPSA) membership, student identification card, recreation facilities, and Otago Polytechnic internet access and the Student Health Centre. Additional course costs, such as material and equipment charges may also apply, and further information on those costs will be sent to you with your offer of place.

Grandparenting of Tuition Fees

Fees for international students studying a programme of two or more years come under our Grandparenting scheme. Grandparenting means that the tuition fees for the standard length of the programme will be set at the start of the first year of study, and will remain the same for each year of study. Grandparenting will only apply when a student's enrolment is continuous, for the standard time period to complete their qualification – e.g. two years for a diploma, three years for a degree. If a student takes longer than the standard time to complete a qualification, the tuition fee for the additional year/s will be charged at the rate for that programme, for each year.
