It is financial support for a person with a disability undergoing a period of assessment, work experience, training or education as part of their plan to gain open employment. It targets those with high support needs. People with disabilities It may be used: * for the provision of a support person to help sustain access to a training course and/or associated expense * to pay transport costs, not covered by the disability allowance, to attend a training opportunity or work experience * to pay for special equipment which is not covered by other provisions. Training Support Funds can only be used for training opportunities that are linked to the NZQA framework, or involve other educational institutions approved by the Ministry of Social Development.

If you can get a Student Allowance you may also be able to receive a Step Up Scholarship. This Scholarship can help fund your compulsory course fees.

To be considered for a Step Up Scholarship you'll need to:

- be entitled to a Student Allowance when you start your course,
- start your course at the start of first semester (usually between January and March) each year,
- be under 24 years old* when you start your course,

- pay \$1000 towards your course fees for each year that you receive the scholarship, and either,
 - be entering tertiary education for the first time and starting a bachelor degree,
- or
- have completed a tertiary qualification below bachelor degree, for example a certificate or diploma. You also need to be starting a bachelor degree that is targeted for Step Up Scholarships to help fill skill shortages in New Zealand.

The Bonded Merit Scholarship is for students starting their second year of study at the start of first semester (between January - March). It recognises academic achievement and pays a maximum of \$3,000 per year for course fees for up to four years, from the second year of study. If you think you'll get a B grade average or better across all your papers in your first year you should consider applying.
